The Government is consulting on whether to allow Town and Parish Councils to submit proposals under the Sustainable Communities Act. Empowerment Funding

£16.7million asset transfer fund

The Community Ownership and Management of Assets (including Right to Bid) Grant Programme, a £16.7million grant fund managed by the Social Investment Business on behalf of the Department for Communities and Local Government, has been opened to support community groups to buy publicly owned assets.

Community organisations will be able to get support to acquire and manage assets through

pre-feasibility grants of between £5,000 and £10,000 to help them build the internal capacity needed to take ownership of assets. Organisations that can show evidence of plans to take over land or buildings can apply for grants of between £10,000 and £100,000 to help undertake feasibility studies to take on asset ownership and management.

See it and Believe it fund

The National Community and Trust Network's peer to peer learning exchange programme for community organisations, See it and Believe it, is now open for applications. The programme gives new projects the chance to visit successful Community Land Trusts across the country, to learn from their experience and share ideas.

Low carbon heat grants

Community groups across the country are now eligible to apply for a share of £8million to install low carbon heating, including solar thermal panels, biomass boilers and heat pumps into homes in their local area.

To apply groups need to submit a first stage application to the Energy Saving

Trust by 7 September. Applications will be judged on a range of criteria, including the project's vision, potential benefits for the local area, potential partners and any relevant experience of delivering similar projects.

The Department of Energy and Climate Change expects to support between 50 and 100 projects through the £8million fund and will announce the winners in December this year. For further information visit www.decc.gov.uk/en/content/cms/news/pn12 087/pn12 087.aspx.

Community grown food

The Department for Communities and Local Government has published new 'how-to' advice to inspire communities to spot disused green spaces in their local areas and it use for food growing. A recent survey revealed that nearly two thirds of adults want to grow their own food. Unfortunately it is increasingly difficult as local authority allotments are significantly oversubscribed, with waiting lists over ten times longer than those in 1996.

The publication, which can be downloaded at www.communities.gov.uk/publications/communities/foodgrowingguide, gives local people practical advice on new ways to get access to less conventional sources of land and green space to grow their own food as well as suggestions for wider community involvement, helpful tips on how to get funding and examples of projects already in bloom.
