Consultation on rural issues within LEPs

The Commission for Rural Communities wants to hear views from Local Enterprise Partnerships, the VCS, the business community, and those operating in the public sector on how LEPs are including rural areas within their work, including what you think are the top priorities that will help ensure that rural areas are considered by LEPs, and the different ways in which LEPs are recognising rural interests.

Empowerment Funding

Rural Community Broadband Fund

The second round of the £20million Rural Community Broadband Fund has opened, which aims to enable whole communities in remote rural areas to get superfast broadband to help transform their businesses and the wider community.

The fund complements the Government's £530 million Broadband Delivery UK programme to provide superfast broadband to 90 percent of every county. The Rural Community Broadband Fund allows for communities in the remaining ten percent to develop projects for a superfast broadband connection.

Paths for Communities grant scheme

The Department for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (Defra) has asked Natural England to develop and run a new Paths for Communities grant

scheme, to encourage and enable local communities to work with land owners to develop and enhance local public paths.

Expected wider benefits of the scheme include more appeal to visitors and tourists and boosting the rural economy through improved support for local services such as shops, pubs, hotels, bed & breakfasts, equestrian and cycle businesses.

The anticipated funding for the scheme will be £1million a year for 2012/13 and 2013/14. For further information on the grant scheme, including how to apply, visit www.naturalengland.org.uk/ourwork/access/rightsofway/default.aspx.

Community Right to Build support service

Locality, in partnership with HACT and Urban Forum, has announced that they are running the Community Right to Build support service. The Community Right to Build will allow people to build homes and facilities for the community without going through the usual planning process.

Locality and its partners will provide free expert support through the new website http://mycommunityrights.org.uk, which includes information and resources supporting communities at all stages of the process, including getting started, looking for legal advice or information on a business case. There will also be a dedicated advice service with access to specialists in the Community Right to Build.

Part of the Localism Act, the Community Right to Build is one of four rights contained in the Localism Act. The Community Rights support services are funded by the Department for Communities and Local Government with the Community Right to Bid and to Challenge in effect from June/July 2012.

Community Rights website

The Department for Communities and Local Government has launched Community Rights, a new website aimed at promoting community ownership of local amenities, ahead of new regulations on the issue coming into force next month. The Community Rights website has been launched by the Communities and Local Government department before regulations on community ownership come into force next month.

The website at http://communityrights.communities.gov.uk highlights changes in the law intended to help community groups take over buildings or public services, or build new facilities through an abridged planning process. It also includes case studies and maps of schemes where community groups took over the running of buildings or services or been involved in designing a new development.

Top Tips for Public Events

Community Matters, together with the Big Lunch, the Sport and Recreation Alliance, Streets Alive, the Department for Transport and the Local Government Association have brought together the main information you might need when organising a public event.
