Inclusion Governance

Update from Jane Howson: VCSE representative on the D2N2 Board

The D2N2 Board met on the 18th October; the first meeting led by our new Chair, Elizabeth Fagan. The meeting covered two substantial items for the LEP, both of which have implications for the work of D2N2 in the future.

The first is the long-awaited new draft Strategic Economic Plan (SEP) for D2N2 which received approval. The new SEP sees a shift in emphasis towards two major challenges – increasing productivity and progression towards a fuller, better skilled and more inclusive labour market. The SEP is now [live](#) on the D2N2 website with a range of consultation events taking place over the coming weeks. You can book to attend events [here](#). I would encourage all stakeholders to engage with the consultation process either via an event or through direct submission using this [link](#).

The second major update was on the LEP Review and highlights the areas in which D2N2 needs to take action in order to become compliant. There are 4 areas to be addressed:

1. Incorporation.
2. Board composition – shifting towards 2/3 business/private sector membership.
3. Accountable body – reducing from the current spread model across three organisations down to a single accountable body and;
4. Addressing issues of overlap – overlaps between LEPs are to be removed therefore negotiations with North Notts and Derbys districts are currently ongoing to resolve our overlap with Sheffield City Region.

ESIF Programme Updates

Open calls: ESF

D2N2 currently has one ESF Open Call under Priority Axis 1.1: Access to Employment for Jobseekers and Inactive People.

This call for proposals aims to support unemployed and inactive participants into employment and self-employment and has a total call value of £8.1m ESF with stage 1 for applications closing 28th December.

There will be two Technical Assistance events supporting this call on the 22nd November (Nottingham) and 28th November (Derby). You can reserve a place [here](#).

ESFA Opt-in calls – now closed

The ESFA opt-in calls for co-financed ESF activity for D2N1 Youth Engagement, Skills Support for the Workforce and Redundancy and the D2N2 Community (Grants) Programme has now closed. Further details on successful projects will be shared as soon as we are able.

D2N2 ESF Uplift

D2N2 ESIF Sub-Committee has now received formal notification of uplift to the D2N2 ESF allocation as a result of Foreign Exchange rate changes. Full details of the uplift can be found in this [correspondence](#) from Dr Catherine Blair, Head of European Social Fund Division, DWP.

ESF moves to Single-Stage Full Application process – from 29th October

From the start of the ESF 2014-2020 Programme, the standard application process for Direct Bid Projects has involved two separate stages – an Outline Application and Full Application stage. Whilst this approach has supported complementarity with the same two-stage process operated by other European Structural and Investment Funds in England, the ESF Managing Authority has been constantly seeking ways of increasing speed and efficiency across the application and appraisal processes.

Following recent use of Single-Stage Full Application processes for isolated, specific elements of the ESF Programme – e.g. Youth Employment Initiative calls, the ESF Managing Authority has agreed to adopt this approach across the whole of the Programme for all new open calls published on or after Monday 29 October.

The use of a Single-Stage Full Application process aims to simplify access to ESF funding for applicants. It will also reduce the overall timescales from call publication to Funding Agreement, whilst continuing to ensure the quality and compliance of project proposals against the ESIF Core Selection Criteria.

ESIF and BREXIT – update on contracting and delivery arrangements.

The draft Withdrawal Agreement between the UK and the EU published in March 2018 would mean the UK would continue to participate in EU funding programmes until they end in 2023, subject to a final negotiated agreement.

Organisations should continue delivering projects that have been agreed and apply for funding under current arrangements with confidence that the funding guarantee applies even if there is no negotiated agreement between the UK and the EU.

After 29 March 2019 if there is no deal - to provide stability for UK organisations that benefit from EU funding and to provide certainty for organisations who wish to apply for funding, the Government has guaranteed all ERDF, ESF and EU Rural Development projects that would have been funded by the EU for the full 2014-20 programme period.

Youth Opportunity Index – poor performance in D2N2 cities

The second report of the Youth Commission, hosted by the Learning & Work Institute creates a **new Youth Opportunity Index**, a relative measure of education and employment outcomes for young people across England's 150 local education authorities.

Results are driven by the strength of local economies, socioeconomic factors and national policies, as well as local services. They reflect education and employment outcomes for young people living in local authority areas, rather than solely the success of those local authorities.

In D2N2 the cities of Nottingham and Derby rank poorly in the index, with Nottingham ranked as bottom of the table national.

Improving Adult Digital Skills: Consultation live

In January 2018, Anne Milton, Minister of State for Apprenticeships and Skills, announced the introduction of full funding for adults who need them to take basic digital skills courses from 2020.

Adults will have the opportunity to undertake improved digital courses based on new national standards setting out the digital skills people need to get on in life and work. The new entitlement will be funded through the national Adult Education Budget (AEB).

Views are invited on the Government's plans to improve basic digital skills training for adults through a [formal consultation process](#). The deadline for submissions is 10th January 2019.
