1.1	Jane welcomed everyone to the meeting. There were no new declarations of interest.	
2.0	D2N2 Board and ESIF committee – key points of next meeting	
2.1	Key items for discussion will be SEP refresh, State of the Economy report (see paper circulated with SIEAG agenda), review of LEP performance, ESF cliff edge and lack of match, science and innovation audit, post 16 education area review (report online), trial skills portal set up (one stop shop of what's out there), HS2 growth strategy.

2.a.1	<ul> <li>lack of match – letters have been sent to the Managing Authority, ESFA and Big Lottery to express concerns</li> <li>Active Communities small grants programme – concern about defrayal after DWP confirmed that defrayal evidence will be at the point that grant recipients show defrayal from their bank account. This poses a serious risk for the organisation administering the Programme and there was concern about 'clawing back' funding from small community groups which may cause the groups to close</li> <li>a recent enquiry to Big Lottery Fund has resulted in being told that they will not be funding volunteer programmes as they say this is the remit of the Building Better Opportunities programme. However people who volunteer may not necessarily be eligible for the BBO programme</li> <li>concern about ESIF admin processes and beneficiary eligibility being too complicated and onerous</li> <li>importance of the ESIF programme and how it benefits individuals and communities that need it</li> <li>people accessing support are now showing more complex and challenging needs (one project showed that 90% of beneficiaries had mental health issues). This has been recognised at national level but as yet has not been translated into a funded programme</li> <li>recent report by NCVO showing 38% decrease in VCSE income</li> <li>Inclusive Growth – see report by Nottingham Civic Exchange and RSA (circulated with the agenda)</li> <li>Growth is not reaching all areas and is actually driving further inequalities. There is a need to ensure this does not happen and social inequalities is high on the D2N2 agenda, with it being included as part of the SEP refresh. The BBC has also published an article on debt, showing Nottingham City as being 4th on the list of areas where more than 20% of residents have problem debt.</li> </ul>	Potential to set up task & finish group to focus on inclusive growth

7a	Active Inclusion grants programme	
7a.1	The Active Inclusion grants programme has been launched and the open call closes on 27/9/17. Two workshops have been held with lead applicant/delivery partner interest details circulated to attendees. Delegates expressed concern about the need to find 50% match, plus the issue of claiming at the point of defrayal from the grant recipient's bank. D2N2 have researched potential sources of match and will be running workshops on match funding.	
7b	ESIF match funding – update and letter to BLF	
7b.1	See draft letter copy circulated with SIEAG agenda – the letter will be sent to Big Lottery encouraging them to continue to provide match funding. There is a similar problem in the Sheffield City Region where open calls (and therefore applicant needs to provide match) have led to no applications being received.
