- 22 Organisations
- Supporting 35 projects

Total level of investment to the VCS in the East Midlands

The 35 projects have a total value ERDF of £15.1m

Split by District:-

Corby	£360k
Derby	£5.64m
Leicester	£2.55m
Lincolnshire	£1m
North Nottinghamshire/ North Derbyshire	£1.73m
Nottingham	£2.1m
Oadby	£331k
East Midlands wide	£1.4m

The value the VCS has added to the programme

The VCS has helped the programme in a number of ways:-

- Through higher intervention of social enterprise projects
- An 'on the ground' 'bottom up approach' led by the beneficiary
- People trust the VCS!

- The VCS are the conduit between Government and the heart of the community

Lessons learnt

- Clarity around eligibility
 - Up front workshops
 - GDT assistance
- Realistic budgeting and phasing
- Pulling together a Programme based approach
 - Creating economies of scale
 - Assistance with ERDF administration but good at working on the ground
 - Pool resources and knowledge with a lead organisation
- Move to output related funding on the new Programme
