The event was a success if assessed on attendance by groups and funding organisations that networked enthusiastically and effectively throughout the day, but it also highlighted challenges that we can't ignore like:

- the time required to find out what's out there and write grant applications,
- the mismatch between who and what mainstream funders sometimes want to fund and the work BME groups want to do,
- and barriers to access like language differences.

It also raised the issue of how public funding cuts and new government policy are changing the context for fundraising, with reductions to the size of some grant funds and growing importance of contracting and commissioning to deliver public services, enterprise activities and fundraising from the public.



Groups who attended were asked to give us their feedback about their experiences of accessing funding and the result was really interesting, especially when considered as 'word clouds'. The bigger the word, the more times that response was given by the delegates when replying to the feedback question.
